Mission Neighborhood Health Center's "Latinos en Extasis" youth program was developed to inspire and empower youth who are interested in social justice and health equity by providing them the resources, skills, and tools they need to become positive leaders among their peers and within their community. With a focus on sexual and reproductive health education, youth participants engage with various topics through a social justice framework. Some of these topics include: reproductive anatomy, sexually transmitted infections (STI), birth control, drug and alcohol use, and healthy relationships.

Under the "Latinos en Extasis" program, participants undergo training through workshops held by Mission Neighborhood Health Center staff to become Peer Outreach Educators (POEs) as a strategy to help address health inequities that affect low-income communities. POEs are responsible for participating in all training workshops, facilitating their own workshops to youth in neighboring community centers, and engaging in other youth development activities.

As a requirement, all participants must be enrolled in high school throughout the course of the program. Each participant is expected to commit 5 hours per week beginning in **September 2017** and ending in **May 2018**. Each participant will receive certification as an MNHC Peer Outreach Educator and a \$590 incentive stipend for their volunteer work in the clinic. Additional benefits include: exposure to jobs/careers in the health field, public speaking skills, group facilitation skills, connecting with resources and other youth in the community and an increase in social consciousness.

We are currently looking for high school students, between the ages of 14 to 18, to become Peer Outreach Educators (POEs). Unfortunately, we are limited to English or Spanish speaking applicants, but we still encourage you to apply if you identify as: Latinx, Black, Asian, Indigenous/Native, Pacific Islander, undocumented, a person with disabilities, economically-disadvantaged and/or LGBTQ.
